

Kona Kai Swim & Racquet Club
Rules and Regulations ~ Issued October 1, 2003 [updated Oct 05]

Section I. Club Membership, Guests and Records

A. General Rules

1. Membership privileges will be extended to all members of the Club Member's immediate family, significant other, and the children of a significant other residing in the Club Member's household (excerpt from Bylaws Article II. Section 2).
2. Members may use the facilities from dawn until 10:00 PM. The regular office hours for the Club are **9:00 AM to 5:00 PM**, seven (7) days per week except holidays. The office hours will be posted and will vary due to the seasons, maintenance requirements and staffing limitations. Club hours are set by the Board of Directors and maintained at the discretion of the Club Manager.
3. Children of a Club Member (age 15 and under) must be supervised by a person 18 years or older when they visit the Club. **The laws for the state of California specify that children age 14 and under must have adult supervision.**
4. A) Breaking of Club rules and/or improper behavior (but not property destruction).
B) Destruction or removal of Club property at Kona Kai.

The procedure for (A)

- A first step - phone call to member family by the Vice President immediately after the incident.
- A letter will be sent and filed, explaining the incident and the rules as they should have been followed.
- Should there be a repetition, a second letter would be sent stating this is a repeated offense with the following sanctions:
 - (a) that there will be a three month suspension of the offender's Club privileges if they are over 18, or
 - (b) if the offender is under 18, that they must have parental supervision when at the Club, for a specific amount of time.A third offense would suspend the family membership for one year.

The procedure for (B)

Any behavior regarding destruction or removal of Club property, or illegal behavior, will result in immediate suspension of the membership pending an inquiry.

5. **Anyone who has used the indoor facilities is responsible** for closing **doors**, switching off **lights**, and switching off the **T.V.** when they leave.
6. **It is the responsibility of the Club Member to make sure that their children and guest children know and obey the Club's Rules & Regulations.**
7. The directory of Members is for the private use of Members only, and may not be used for any commercial, fund raising, or mailshot activities.

B. Guest(s)

1. A Club Member must accompany their guest(s) while they are on the Club's premises. Guest fees are applicable whether or not guests use the Club's facilities.
2. **The Club Member must sign in their guest(s) upon arrival at the Club.** Sign-in sheets are available in the foyer by the front door during the Club's operating hours (9:00 AM to 5:00 PM). Outside the Club's operating hours, guest(s) may be signed in at the Tennis Patio notice board.
3. The same guest may only come to the Club a total of 5 times in any one month, regardless of who signs them in.
4. Additional/late arriving guests must be signed in upon their arrival
5. For groups of less than 10 people, the Club's guest fees are as follows: \$3.00 per adult, \$1.00 per child (under the age of 18) and \$1.00 for extended family members. Fees for parties of 10 or more people (inclusive of the members) are covered in Section III.
6. Members will be invoiced quarterly for all appropriate guest fees as part of their regular billing.
7. The Board of Directors may waive or alter guest fees due to special circumstances or for specific events.
8. Prospective Members may be admitted one time at no charge with the approval of the Club Manager.

C. Club Records

1. The Club's Bylaws permit Members to access certain records associated with the operation of the Club. Those records that are specifically available to Members are: the Club's Bylaws, a list of the Club's Membership, Board Minutes, and Monthly/Annual Financial Reports.
2. These Club Records will be made available to Members Monday through Friday during the Club's operating hours, except on Holidays.
3. The Club's Board Minutes and Monthly Financial Reports for the current year and two prior years are available. Prior years' information is archived and will have to be obtained for viewing. If a Member wishes to view one or more of these archived documents, a request will have to be made to the Club Manager. The Club Manager will then arrange within the next two weeks to have the requested Club Record(s) available for viewing.
4. If a Club Member wishes to review any other Club Record(s), they will have to make a request to the Board for approval to view the Club Record(s). If the Board approves the request, then the Board will also establish a time with the Club Manager when the requested Record(s) will be made available.

Section II. General Club Rules

A. Clubhouse/Facility Rules

1. The Club Manager's Office, the Swim Coach's Office and the Tennis Coach's office are considered "Private Club Offices" and are not to be entered by any Member(s) without permission. The limitation to entering these offices also covers the use of any equipment contained therein including, but not limited to, personal computers, printers, fax machines, telephones, copiers, and sporting equipment. Accordingly, no Member has any "right" to enter these "Private Club Offices" or use any of the equipment contained therein. This restriction is due to the presence of confidential files, office and sporting goods supplies and equipment that are maintained within these Club Offices.
2. The Clubhouse, Facilities and Grounds are to be kept in good order at all times. Members are expected to help keep the Club a clean and pleasant facility for all to enjoy. The Club does not maintain a staff to clean the facilities during the operating hours, and therefore the assistance of the members is needed to preserve the Club's appearance.
3. **Children (15 years old and under) must be supervised** by an individual who is at least 18 years of age while they are using the **Club Main Room, the Club Games Room or Club Kitchen.**
4. No running, shouting, horseplay or **unruly behavior** is permitted in any part of the Clubhouse.
5. No wet swimsuits are allowed in the Clubhouse with the exception of the locker rooms through their respective poolside entries or to pass through the foyer to the parking lot.
6. Use of the Club Kitchen area is on a first come, first serve basis. Members and their guests are required to clean up after themselves, particularly in the Club Kitchen. This includes any spills either inside the oven, on the stovetops, the countertops, refrigerator or the floor. Please leave the Club Kitchen in a clean and orderly state so that it is ready for the next member to use. Should a Member leave the kitchen in a mess and the janitors be needed to clean the kitchen, the Member will be charged a fine in the amount of \$25.

B. Club Furniture & Equipment

1. No furniture or equipment of any kind may be removed from the Club without the knowledge and the approval of the Club Manager.
2. Anyone who moves Club furniture (including pool and tennis patio furniture) from one part of the Club to another is responsible for returning the furniture to its original location.
3. Only authorized staff members may move the furniture in the Club's Main Room located off the foyer.

4. The Club's furniture and equipment is to be treated with care and used for its intended purpose only. This means that chairs are not treated as trampolines or climbing structures.
5. The patio furniture located around the pool areas is not to be used as pool toys or placed in the pools at any time.

C. Food & Beverage Consumption Limitations

1. Consumption of food and beverages is confined to the tennis patio tables, the pool deck tables and the picnic areas. No glass containers of any kind are permitted in the pool areas, which includes both the Olympic Pool and the Kiddie Pool.
2. Under special circumstances, consumption of food and drink will be allowed in the Clubhouse, but only with the approval of the Club Manager.
3. **No food or drink is allowed in the Club Games Room at any time**, unless with the permission of the Manager.
4. Those eating and drinking in the designated areas are responsible for cleaning and straightening the area upon their departure. This includes the removal of all containers, bags and litter. **Party litter or large amounts of trash are to be bagged up and disposed of in the dumpster at the back of the Club.** Lesser amounts (that will not fill up the receptacle) may be placed in the trash containers located around the Club. The tables are to be wiped clean of any liquids or crumbs, so as not to attract insects and especially wasps.
5. Those Club Members who fail to clean the table area after their meal or snack may be subject to a fine. If the area requires significant cleaning by either the Club's staff or janitors a fine of \$25 will be assessed to the Club Member's quarterly invoice.

D. Club Telephone

1. The Club makes available to all members a telephone located by the front door in the foyer for local calls only.
2. Members are asked to place all outgoing calls from this telephone. The telephone located in the Club Manager's Office is strictly for the use of the Office staff; therefore, please do not ask to use the Club's Office telephone.

E. Club's Lost & Found

1. Articles such as clothing, which remain in the Club's lost and found containers for more than 30 days, will be donated to various charitable organizations.
2. Articles of greater value such as jewelry, tennis racquets, and eyeglasses will be held in the Club Office, or in a locked area controlled by the Club Manager.

F. Pets & Animals

1. Generally, all pets and animals with the exception of Seeing Eye dogs are not allowed on the Club's premises.

2. If there is a special event or reason that an animal or pet is needed on the Club's premises, you must obtain the Club Manager's approval in advance. The animal(s) are to be accompanied by an adult at all times and are to be controlled and cleaned up after by those accompanying the animal(s).
3. Failure to clean up after the animal(s) will result in a charge of \$25 to the Club Member's quarterly invoice.

G. Use of Club Sports Equipment

1. If any sports equipment such as basketballs, volleyballs, or table tennis items are borrowed from the Club Office, they must be returned to the Club Office when you have finished using them.
2. If you fail to return the sports equipment to the Club Office and the items are lost, the Club Member will be charged on their quarterly invoice for the replacement of the equipment.

H. Restrictions on Bicycles, Skateboards, Roller-skates, and Roller-blades

1. Bicycles, skateboards, roller-skates, and roller-blades are not allowed on the Club's premises.
2. Bicycles are to be placed in the bicycle rack at the front of the Club in the parking area unless at the manager's discretion.
3. Skateboards, roller-skates and roller-blades are to be kept in the possession of the user on the Club's premises.

Section III. Party and Rental Rules

A. General Rules

1. Members may book sections of the Club for the purposes of holding a party, picnic or other function. **Due to the potential of conflicts arising between a party and the use of the Club by the general membership, parties are one of the most regulated operations of the Club.**
2. The Club is available to Members to hold a party. A fee will be assessed for all parties held at the Club. The fee will be based upon the total size of the party/group and whether the party is an indoor or outdoor party. Additional fees may be assessed for specific services or individual requirements of the party/groups. **All parties/groups must be confirmed and completed contractually with the Club Manager in advance.**
3. The Member who wishes to reserve the Club for a function **must be in attendance** during the event.
4. The maximum number of attendees permitted for a Member's function at the Club is 100 for an indoor party and 65 for an outdoor party. Should a Member wish to hold a function which exceeds these numbers they will need to obtain Board approval for the event in advance.

5. Groups of 10 or more but less than 16 people (**inclusive of any Members**) wishing to use an outdoor area, require a reservation. A reservation requires that the Member call the Club in advance and speak to the Club Manager to determine if there is a conflict with any other events. **Club-sponsored parties**, i.e. those that are comprised entirely of Members, or any tournaments/functions organized by the **Tennis or Swim Committees, must also be authorized by the Club Manager.**
6. Fees will be charged for all parties according to the total number of guests and/or Members and the location of the party (indoor, outdoor, or both). The schedule of fees is detailed in the following sections.
7. For classification purposes:
 - A **group** is 10 to 15 people.
 - A **small party** is 16 to 25 people.
 - A **medium sized party** is 26 to 40 people.
 - A **large party** is 41 or more people.
8. **School parties are not permitted.** There is a maximum of twenty (20) children per party with a minimum of one (1) adult for every five (5) children. These adults must be in “**active supervision**” of the children. Should a Member wish to have more than 20 children at a function, they will have to request Board approval for the number of children attending.
9. The combined total of people in all scheduled **outdoor** groups or parties at any one time on a given day will be no more than 65. The maximum total for **indoor** groups or parties is 100. This prevents overcrowding of the Club facilities and allows the other Members with their families or guests a place to relax and enjoy. Due to this limitation in the number of guests, **only one large party** will be permitted on any given day.
10. **To ensure maximum usage and enjoyment of the Club’s facilities, the following fines will apply.**

If the actual total number of attendees at a booked party varies above or below the original booked number by more than **20%**, the Member will be assessed a fine equal to the percentage variation times \$100.

For instance, if the booking is for 40 people and only 20 turn up, the fine will be \$50 (50% x \$100). The Club understands that the number of attendees at a function will vary for a number of reasons, which is why we have allowed for a 20% fluctuation.

If a party is cancelled without the required notice being given to the Club Manager, (as per rental/reservation agreement), the fine will be \$100.
11. All outdoor parties must observe the City ordinance pertaining to noise. Outdoor noise is to be minimal after 10:00 PM.
12. All parties and functions at the Club will end by 11:00 PM. Should the party wish to have a later ending time, the Member will have to obtain Board approval. There may be an additional charge for a later ending time.

13. Set-up for parties may begin at 10:00 AM. We ask that parties not begin any earlier than 11:00 AM. Parties beginning earlier than 11:00 AM will require Board approval.
14. If any damage to the Club's premises, equipment or furniture occurs during a party, the cost to repair the damage will be assessed to the Member's account.

B. Outdoor Party Rules & Rentals

1. Members may book outdoor sections of the Club for the purpose of holding a party, picnic or other function. The areas that can be reserved are the Playground Area, the Tennis Hill, and the Barbeque Pit. The Barbeque Pit may not be reserved exclusively if demand is great on a particular day. The outdoor rental does not include the use of any of the Club's indoor premises not considered a common area. Common areas are the kitchen, locker rooms, and bathrooms.
2. Outdoor parties are restricted to a maximum of 65 attendees. A party with more than 65 attendees will require prior Board approval.
3. The Member will be charged a fee for the party depending upon the total size of the group, and the areas that are reserved. **There are no separate guest fees**, simply the party fee based upon the total number of attendees – guests and/or Members.

From October 1, 2003 the fees are set at the following amounts:

- a. 10 -15 attendees \$30
- b. 16 - 25 attendees \$50
- c. 26 - 40 attendees \$80
- d. 41 - 65 attendees \$130

If the area(s) are left in a clean and orderly condition, there are no additional charges. If the janitors are needed to clean the area, a \$25 cleaning fee will be assessed to the Member's account.

4. Use of the Club's two swimming pools is permitted. However, the Member is to make sure that there is sufficient active supervision by adults (18 years of age or older) of children attending the function. **Children 6 and over** may not use the Kiddie Pool unless they have permission from the lifeguard or Manager on duty.
5. All party attendees must obey the lifeguards and the Club's Pool Rules & Etiquette.
6. Members are not permitted to hire their own lifeguards.
7. **Use of the Club's tennis courts is restricted to one tennis court.** At least one Member must be on the court. Use of more than one tennis court requires prior Board approval.
8. Additional rules associated with outdoor reservations are outlined in the Club's Reservations and Rental Agreement.

C. Indoor Party Rules & Rentals

1. Members may book the main Clubroom exclusively for the purposes of holding a party or other function. **The Games Room may be reserved in conjunction with**

the main Clubroom for an additional fee. However, exclusivity to the Games Room cannot be guaranteed.

2. The maximum number of attendees for an indoor party is 100. A party with more than 100 attendees requires prior Board approval.
3. **An Indoor Party Rental does not include** the use of any of the Club's outdoor premises, such as the Tennis Courts, Tennis Patio, Swimming Pools, Play Areas and Barbeque Pit.
4. The Member will be charged a fee for the party depending upon the total size of the party and the areas that are reserved. There are no separate guest fees, simply the party fee based upon the number of attendees – guests and/or Members.
From October 1, 2003, the fees are set at the following amounts:
 - a. 15 - 25 attendees \$150
 - b. 26 - 40 attendees \$250
 - c. 41 - 65 attendees \$325
 - d. 66 -100 attendees \$400

If the area(s) are left in a clean and orderly condition, there are no additional charges. If the janitors are needed to clean the area, a \$50.00 cleaning fee will be assessed to the Member.

5. Any party that has more than 30 attendees is required to have the Clubroom furniture removed for the event. To have the Clubroom furniture retained in the room with more than 30 guests requires Board approval.
6. Parties of more than 30 people, where the furniture is removed from the Clubroom, access to the Games Room will be restricted due to the storage of the furniture in the Games Room.
7. Additional rules associated with the rental are outlined in the Club's Reservation & Rental Agreement.

D. Indoor/Outdoor Party Rules & Rentals

1. Members may book the Clubroom exclusively for the purposes of holding a party, as well as a portion of the Club's outdoor area. The Games Room may be reserved in conjunction with the main Clubroom for an additional fee. However, exclusivity to the Games Room cannot be guaranteed.
2. The maximum size of an indoor/outdoor party is 100 attendees. A party with more than 100 attendees requires Board approval.
3. An Indoor/Outdoor Party Rental may include the use of any of the Club's outdoor premises, such as the Swimming Pools, Play Area and Barbeque Pit. However, **these areas will need to be defined in advance.**
4. The Member will be charged a fee for the party depending upon the total size of the party and the areas that are reserved. There are no separate guest fees, simply the party fee based upon the number of attendees – guests and/or Members.

From October 1, 2003, the fees are set at the following amounts:

- a. 15 - 25 attendees \$225
- b. 26 - 40 attendees \$350
- c. 41 - 65 attendees \$425
- d. 66 - 100 attendees \$530

If the area(s) are left in a clean and orderly condition, there are no additional charges. If the janitors are needed to clean the area, a \$50.00 cleaning fee will be assessed to the Member.

- 5. Any party that has more than 30 attendees is required to have the Clubroom furniture removed for the event. To have the Clubroom furniture retained in the room with more than 30 guests requires Board approval.
- 6. Parties of more than 30 people, where the furniture is removed from the Clubroom, access to the Games Room will be restricted due to the storage of the furniture in the Games Room.
- 7. Members are not permitted to hire their own lifeguards.
- 8. Additional rules associated with the rental are outlined in the Club's Reservation & Rental Agreement.

Section IV. Use of the Play Area, Barbeques and Picnic Areas

- 1. When children are using the Club's Play Area (the area containing the play structures and swings), **they must be supervised by an adult.**
- 2. Children or adults leaving the Play area must shower before entering the Pool Area. Sand around the Play Area can be easily tracked into the pool on the feet, hands or clothing, and block the filters.
- 3. Sand must not be thrown or removed from the Play Area.
- 4. Members are required to pick up after themselves and their children in the Barbeque Pit and Picnic Areas. The barbeques are to be cleaned after use and any trash is to be disposed of in one of the many trash receptacles. If you accumulate a large quantity of trash, it is to be placed in the dumpster at the back of the Club and not crammed into one of the smaller trash containers.

Section V. Swimming and Pool Etiquette Rules

A. General Pool Rules

- 1. The Club has contracted with its Swim Coach that only the Swim Coach or his alternate(s) are permitted to provide instruction to either a Member or guest using the Club's pools. Should a Member or guest wish to have a swim lesson at Kona Kai from someone other than the Club Swim Coach, they will have to make the necessary financial and other arrangements with the Club's Manager and Swim Coach.
- 2. **Everyone is required to shower before entering the pools.**

3. Lifeguards, under the supervision of the Club Manager, are in complete authority over activities in and around the Pools. This includes the authority to eject Members or guests from the Pool and/or Pool Area for behavior they deem to be unruly or unsafe.
4. When a lifeguard is not on duty, children (15 years old and under) may use the Pools only when supervised by an adult (18 years or older). Anyone 16 years old or older may swim unsupervised – **at their own risk**.
5. Anyone coming to swim when the Main Pool is covered is responsible for properly **removing and replacing the pool covers**. This means rolling the pool covers properly on the rollers.
6. During the months that the Pools are covered (normally the months of October through May), swimmers are responsible for covering and uncovering the Pool. If a member does not know how to pull the covers safely, they must receive instructions on the procedure from the club Manager
7. Children wearing water wings or other flotation devices must be accompanied by an **adult in the water**. This rule applies even if there are lifeguards on duty.
8. No glass articles of any kind are allowed in either the Main Pool or the Kiddie Pool or the areas around them.
9. Proper swim attire must be worn at all times when swimming. Absolutely no cut-offs, shorts – other than swim shorts - or shoes are permitted in the Pools.
10. Personal floating devices, air mattresses, large balls, etc, will be allowed when there are 15 or fewer persons in the Main Pool. Air mattresses or other large flotation devices are not permitted in the Kiddie Pool.
11. Anyone using the Club's pool toys or swimming equipment (kickboards, leg floats, noodles, diving rings, etc.) **are required to return these articles to their proper container after use**. The lifeguards are not there to pick up after the Club's Members and their children. A clean up fee could be added to the members account.

B. Kiddie Pool Rules

1. The Kiddie Pool is limited to **children who are under 6 years of age**.
2. When a child is present in the Kiddie Pool area, an adult must accompany the child. This rule applies even if there is a lifeguard present.
3. Children 2 years and under, or any who wear diapers must wear an **approved swimming baby diaper** when in or around the either the Main Pool or the Kiddie Pool.

C. Main Pool Rules

1. Adult swim will be called every hour at the start of the hour for the first 15 minutes.

2. The first two lanes of the Main Pool will be set aside for use by lap swimmers and for approved swim lessons.
3. Use of the swim lanes by lap swimmers will be on a first come, first served basis.
4. **No tennis balls or other hard balls are allowed in the Main Pool.**
5. No diving of any form is allowed in the Main Pool.
6. Chaise lounges in the Pool Area are reserved for the use of adults.
7. If the Pool Area furniture is moved, it should be returned to its original position when the user is finished with it.
8. There will be no running, pushing, splashing or dunking. No disorderly conduct will be tolerated. Repeated infractions will be referred to the Club Manager and may result in the suspension of pool privileges.
9. When swimming in the Main Pool, swimmers are not to hang, pull or play on the **lane lines**. Swimmers are to swim **under** the lane lines. Repeated violations of this rule may result in the suspension of pool privileges.

Section VI. Tennis Rules

A. General

1. The Club has contracted with its Tennis Pro that only the Club Pro or his alternate(s) are permitted to provide instruction to either a Member or guest on the Club's tennis courts. Should a Member or guest wish to have a tennis lesson at Kona Kai from someone other than the Club Pro, they will have to make the necessary financial and other arrangements with the Club's Manager and Tennis Pro.
2. One person may not occupy a tennis court for practice purposes when others are waiting. This includes individual(s) using the practice wall on court 3.
3. Tennis players must wear proper tennis attire at all times. Proper tennis attire means
 - a) a shirt must be worn,
 - b) your general appearance reflects the sport you are about to play,
 - c) tennis shoes with non-marking soles and predominately white upper materials are required, so as not to damage the tennis courts, **no bare feet or sandals.**
4. Tennis players are not permitted to either step over or jump over the tennis nets, as this is a potential safety hazard. Sitting or leaning on the nets is not permitted as this will stretch and eventually damage the cable supporting the net.
5. No more than four (4) tennis players, one of whom must be a member, may occupy a tennis court.
6. No food is permitted on the tennis courts. Glass containers and alcoholic beverages are not permitted. Water and sports drinks may be taken onto the tennis courts provided that they are in plastic or metal containers.

7. **Players vacating a court are to remove all of their equipment and debris, such as can lids, cups, beverage containers, etc.**
8. Tennis players leaving a court must close the gates and turn off the tennis court lights if no one is waiting.
9. Children are permitted on the tennis courts only if they are playing tennis. Children that are immediately outside the tennis court perimeter fence must not constitute a nuisance to the other tennis players and observers.
10. Juniors are permitted to play in the adult championships. They may only participate in other tournaments and tennis socials with the permission of the organizers.
11. **All play on the tennis courts must cease promptly at 10:00 PM.** As well as a Club regulation, this is a Santa Clara City ordinance requiring all tennis lights to be extinguished by 10:00 PM.
12. **Anyone who borrows a Club water cooler is required to empty it and return it to the cupboard after use.**

B. Tennis Court Priorities and Procedures

1. Club Tournaments and Interclub Tournaments, as well as other competitions that have been officially sanctioned by the Board of Directors, have priority over general play. The Club Members will be notified of such events at least two weeks in advance. The Tennis Committee will try to post an annual schedule of events for the Club Members, if possible.
2. When others are waiting, play is limited to one hour.
3. Before players take a tennis court, one of the Club Members in the group must sign their name and time on the Club's Tennis Patio blackboard. This must be done whether there are tennis courts available or not. Members must sign up for a court under their own name.
4. When the tennis courts are full, a waiting list will be established on the blackboard located on the Tennis Patio. If the top person on the list is called and they are not on the premises, they will be allowed one pass or they forfeit their position. If the player is present and wishes to pass their turn, they will be allowed one pass, and then must take the next available tennis court or move to the end of the list. So as to avoid confusion, Club Members are requested to use their first initial and last name on the waiting list.
5. **A Club Member is not permitted** to have their name on the waiting list and be playing on one of the tennis courts. The only exception to this rule is when a Club Member is taking a lesson from the Club Tennis Pro on the Teaching Court.
6. **Guests may not sign up for a tennis court** or place their names on the waiting list.
7. The Tennis Pro has priority on the Teaching Court during the times established by the Board of Directors.

8. Junior Tennis Players have the same court privileges as others, except that there can be only one “Junior Tennis Court” when adults are waiting. A “Junior Tennis Court” is defined as one on which more than half the players are juniors. Once a “Junior Tennis Court” has started play, the “Junior Tennis Court” may not be bumped until their time is up.
9. No tennis player or group of tennis players may re-sign for an additional hour’s play prior to the expiration of their initial sign-in time.

C. USTA League Matches and Ladies Inter-Club Matches

1. Courts 4, 5, and 6 will be set aside for USTA League matches from 5:45 PM until completion (approximately 9:30 PM).
2. **The Ladies Inter-Club Matches** that are held on alternating Thursday mornings starting at 10:00 AM and ending at 12:30 PM **are permitted to use four (4) of the tennis courts simultaneously.**
3. As part of the Ladies Inter-Club competition, competing guests are exempt from the Club’s guest fees during an Inter-Club match.
4. All non-members playing on Kona Kai USTA League teams are subject to **guest fees** for practice games at Kona Kai. No other fee for team membership will be assessed by Kona Kai. Guest fees are not assessed for USTA League matches at Kona Kai.
